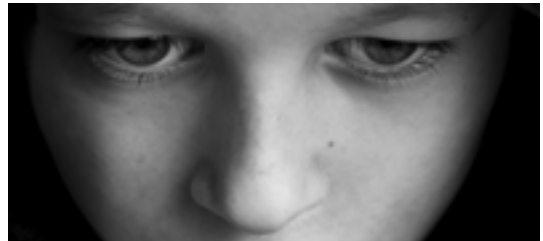
SESSION OVERVIEW & PRESENTER INFORMATION

Human Trafficking Awareness for School Personnel

School personnel are uniquely positioned to identify, and report suspected abuse and connect students to services that can prevent trafficking and even save lives. This presentation will provide information for school personnel which will increase awareness and understanding of human trafficking and help school personnel recognize warning signs of youth who may be victims of human trafficking, what to do if human trafficking is suspected, and resources for assisting victims of trafficking. This presentation will define human trafficking, recruitment, identify risk factors and indicators of human trafficking. Information regarding the increased risks of substance use disorder, sexually transmitted infections and impact on learning for trafficked youth will also be shared. You will leave with knowledge and resources you can use to help protect and prevent at risk youth and youth from becoming victims of human trafficking and know how to respond when a student is an apparent victim.

This session will include 30 minutes for questions and answers and reflection on the information provided to help start the thought process of moving from talking about the issues to acting on them to support NYS students. You will have an opportunity to collaborate with peers and develop ideas on

Human Trafficking Prevention, identification and actions to prevent and assist students who may be trafficked to your district administration.

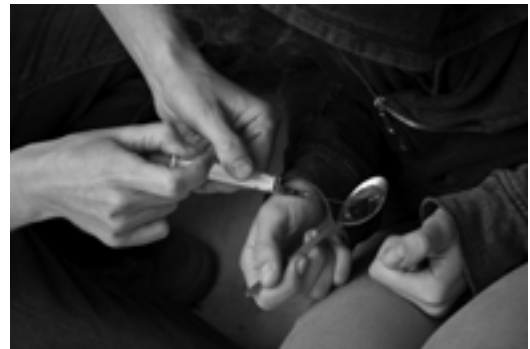

SESSION OVERVIEW & PRESENTER INFORMATION

Drug Awareness for School Personnel

This presentation is for school personnel with student health and safety in mind. This presentation is NOT designed to train someone as an expert but, rather to provide a basic overview of what to look for regarding signs and symptoms of possible impairment and to understand appropriate next steps in a school setting. This presentation is designed to serve as a segue between the classroom teacher or school administrators who maybe observing a change in student behavior which would prompt the need for an evaluation of the student's health. This presentation is designed to assist school medical personnel in assessing presenting symptoms and evaluate whether a student's symptoms are related to a health condition or could instead be caused by substance use. This presentation will provide the tools to determine if further assessment, evaluation, and possible treatment is needed by an appropriate health care provider.

The information in this course will also be valuable to school health educators who provide substance use education as part of the health education curriculum. This session will include 30 minutes for questions and answers and allow you to reflect on the information provided to help start the thought process of moving from talking about the issues to acting on them to support NYS students. You will have opportunity to collaborate with peers and develop ideas on identification of students who need assistance and actions to screen for, prevent and assist students who may be impaired or experiencing a medical issue.



About Sergeant Jonathan Cook

New York State Police, Impaired Driving Program Coordinator

Technical Sergeant Jonathan David Cook joined the New York State Police on June 10, 2013. He was assigned to State Police Oneonta in Troop C where he worked as a road patrol unit until his promotion to Sergeant on July 12, 2018. As a road Trooper, Sergeant Cook served as a Field Training Officer, a Patrol Rifleman, a Standardized Field Sobriety Test (SFST) Instructor, a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE), and a DRE Instructor. He is currently assigned to Division Traffic Services where he is assigned as the Impaired Driving Program Coordinator. His responsibilities include programming, coordinating and instructing New York State Police SFST, Drug Recognition Expert, Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement and drug awareness courses and trainings. In addition, he is responsible for managing grant funding for the entirety of his programming. He has a strong background in education, having worked as a high school English and Special Education teacher for eight years prior to his career in law enforcement. During his education career, he obtained a Bachelor's in English and Education from Colgate University, a Master's degree in Special Education from Grand Canyon University and completed coursework for an advanced certificate in Educational Leadership from Stony Brook University. As a part of his DRE status and his position with the New York State Police, he regularly attends conferences and trainings to keep his knowledge current with regards to trends in his fields of study.
