## Creating Inclusive Schools for NYS LGBT Youth Books and Resources That Promote Inclusion of LGBT Youth and Families

The following resources are provided by the Office of the Administration for Children and Families Early Childhood Learning and Knowledge Center and Head Start.

- <u>Creating a Welcoming Early Childhood Program for LGBT- Headed Families</u> -Provides ways to enhance relationships with parents, who identify as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, or Transgender (LGBT). Directors, teachers, providers, and parents can use these resources to help build strong partnerships
- <u>Partnering with Parents Who Identify as LGBT</u>-Provides information on engaging parents and guardians who identify as LGBT. What you learn can help you create a welcoming and inclusive environment, build staff professionalism, and engage all families in your program
